Kooloorra is slowly emerging from the Covid 19 related shutdown. Many of our essential programs were running with increased outputs during this time. With the support of Second Bite, Harris Farm, Colombo Social and Randwick Council we kept a steady food supply line to our community. Our volunteers and staff worked selflessly through weekends and public holidays to keep the food on the tables.

Kooloorra Vacation Care remained open during the April and July school holidays to provide free vacation care for our essential workers as well as for the most vulnerable families during the shutdown.

Our electricity and gas assistance continued in person and via dedicated phone line and our playgroup briefly moved on Facebook, but is now coming back to the centre. For up to date information on all our programs visit www.kooloorra.org or our Kooloorra Facebook page.

Important Advisory regarding Energy Accounts Payment Assistance (EAPA)

Kooloora Community Centre can now provide assistance with electricity and gas bills over the phone on Tuesdays between 9:30am-3:30pm. This is a temporary measure for the duration of the COVID-19 emergency.

Please note that due to the limited resources at our disposal, electricity and gas assistance program, the priority will be given to the residents living in postcodes 2035 and 2036. We will do our best to assist residents from adjacent postcodes where possible.

To help us assist you with your bill over the phone, please email us a copy (photo on your mobile phone) of your most recent bill, a copy of your photo ID and provide a phone number that we can call you on. Please email this to koolooraaenergy@outlook.com and one of Kooloora team members will contact you to organise the phone assessment. For any questions call Kooloora on 0481 756 759.

Below is an outline of the steps involved in the phone assessment process for energy assistance payments:

1. Email koolooraaenergy@outlook.com with a copy of your photo ID and a copy of your current energy bill
2. We will call you to assess your eligibility for electricity and/or gas vouchers
3. We call your energy provider in a three-way call with yourself.

Phone assessments are conducted on Tuesdays between 9:30am and 3:30pm.

If you are finding it difficult to put food on your table, we got some donated fruits and vegies and cooked meals throughout the week.

During this time of uncertainty, we would like to give priority to vulnerable members of the community who are having a hard time getting access to basic food supply. If you know someone who might need food and could not go to the grocery, please let us know.

We were still unable to run excursions during the program but we made up for it with some fantastic incursions.



The ten day program included 6 in centre days and 4 incursion days. The in centre days were: B Day, Olympics Day, Community Day, Its My Birth Day, Carnival Day and NAIDOC Day. The incursions were Indigenous Sports Day, balloon show with Buster the Balloonatic and a magic show with Benny the Magician. The children particularly loved the balloon show which was a lot of lively fun.

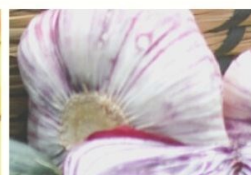

Hand Sanitiser Safety and Children

NSW Health is reminding parents that alcohol-based hand sanitiser is dangerous if ingested, particularly for children.

NSW Poisons Information Centre said while hand sanitiser is an important tool in stopping the spread of COVID-19, it has seen a spike in the number of calls due to hand sanitiser exposure incidents, mostly by babies and young children ingesting it at home.

Genevieve Adamo, Senior Poisons Specialist from the NSW Poisons Information Centre said even a small amount can be harmful for young children and babies.

“Hand sanitiser products should be stored safely and out of reach of children. When they are used by young children it should be under the supervision of an adult. Washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds is also a safe and effective option to help combat COVID-19,” Ms Adamo said.

Consumers are reminded to be aware of imported products which may not be clearly labelled and may contain more toxic alcohols such as methanol that make the product more dangerous. Products may also be packaged in a range of container types, including beverage containers, which can increase the risk of accidental ingestion and poisoning.

Additionally, there have been reports of people making their own hand sanitiser, which may increase the risk of potential poisoning.

Most minor ingestions can be safely managed at home but telephone assessment is still important.

“Regardless of the quantity, people should always call the Poisons Information Centre for first aid and monitoring advice and should ensure they have the container of the ingested product with them,” Ms Adamo said.

“Calling the Poisons Information Centre first to see if you or your child needs to go to hospital may prevent unnecessary visits to the Emergency Department and will help to keep Emergency Departments free for emergencies. In the current climate, it also prevents people increasing their risk of exposure to COVID-19.”

Everyone can help prevent the spread of COVID-19 by practising social distancing, thorough hand washing, cough etiquette and staying home if they're unwell. For advice on possible poisoning, please contact the 24 hour **Poisons Information Centre on 13 11 26**.

EXTRA CLEAN-UP SERVICES



Randwick City households have been given an additional two free clean-up services this year to help get through the COVID-19 pandemic. With more people staying home, there has been an increase in the amount of material put out for kerbside clean-ups as well as an increase in dumped rubbish.

Booked clean-ups increased from 400 tonnes in April 2019 to over 500 tonnes in April 2020, while reports of illegally dumped rubbish increased by 20 per cent to 5,450 reports for the first four months of 2020.

The extra services mean each household is now entitled to seven free on-call clean-ups and one free scheduled collection. Clean-ups can be booked online at randwick.nsw.gov.au/bookmycleanup or by calling 1300 722 542.
